Countries are introduced in alphabetical order based on the host country's official

language. In this case, Portuguese.

In Portuguese, United States is "Estados Unidos da América," alphabetically landing at #70 between the Federated

States of Micronesia (Estados Federados da

Micronésia) and Estonia (Estônia).
